SENATOR CHAMBERS: That is what it is supposed to be but initially that may not happen. There may have to be an appropriation and I can't say that in the future there may not have to be some money appropriated. I am just unable to say that at this point.

SENATOR GEORGE: So you envision this as a temporary measure?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: At this moment...

SENATOR GEORGE: Until they are set up and can probably fund it themselves.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the A bill itself is temporary because we haven't put the bill itself in final form. So that is why I say it does not matter if you advance it or do.

SENATOR GEORGE: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes, do you wish to be recognized on....

SENATOR KEYES: Well just to state that there is a \$100,000 and if Senator Chambers is right and we are going to put this in an existing commission then we won't have to have so much money, and whether you advance it now or whether you wait until we correct the bill, I am a little concerned about advancing something if we don't know how much money it's going to spend. It's like a while ago we advanced a bill the other day that had \$50,000 more money in it than the department asked for, and they thought they could handle the spending of it, and I think they can. I am sure if we set up a committee they can spend this \$100,000. I will go ahead and advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 823A to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The motion is advancement of 823A. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.
