

as the governing boards see fit and certainly they can see only one way. But we are proposing to pay 80 percent of the cost of educating students from outstate. That is what this bill is about, and that is why I object to it.

SENATOR CLARK: Any further discussion? The question is the advancement of 304. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Senator Koch, what do you want to do?

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, it is obvious that we need seven more courageous senators. I ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor say aye....vote aye. Record.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: We are under Call. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. The senators will return to their seats, and please, please check in. We have six absent. Must we call the names out or will you punch in, please. Sergeant at Arms, will you get the rest of them in here, please? Senator Lamb, would you check in, please? Senator Johnson. Senator Chambers. Senator Kelly. Senator Murphy, would you check in, please? Sergeant at Arms could you find Chambers, Pirsch and Kelly. That is the only ones we are short. Senator Koch, do you want call-ins or would you rather have a roll call? All right, we will take call-ins at the present time.

CLERK: Senator Reutzell voting aye. Senator Goodrich voting aye. Senator Kremer changing from no to yes. Senator Chronister voting yes. Senator Barrett voting aye. Senator Fitzgerald voting...you had voted aye, Senator. Senator Kelly voting no. Senator Schmit voting aye. Senator Nichol voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Powers.

CLERK: Senator Powers and Senator Cope voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes and 6 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance.

SENATOR CLARK: The bill is advanced. We will now take up,
