PRESIDENT: I'm certainly glad you pointed that out. I would never believe that in this Legislature. I couldn't believe that. Sergeant at Arms, we are looking for Senator Goodrich I believe. Does anyone have any report on Senator Goodrich? Is he in his office or where is he? Out in the telephone booth. We will raise the Call when we get the people here that are supposed to be here and that includes Senator Goodrich.

CLERK: Senator Barrett voting aye; Senator Chronister voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich is here. Do you want to proceed then?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, raise the Call if that...if I counted right.

PRESIDENT: Report the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules and introduce the bill.

PRESIDENT: All right, the motion carries and the rule is suspended. The motion is to raise the Call. The Call is raised. Read the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, new bill, LB 992, introduced by Senator Kelly and Newell. (Read LB 992 by title for the first time as found on page 937 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: We are ready then for the next request number, 1580.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Maresh moves for the introduction of Request #1580 by the Business and Labor Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is the annual event that takes place to get claims paid by the Legislature, I mean Request #1580 allows the claims and we will have another request to disallow the claims. This is...these are the claims that were heard by the claims board composed of our fearless leader, Lieutenant Governor Luedtke, the State Treasurer and the State Auditor and they recommend which ones should be paid and which should be disallowed and as a committee we will, if it is referred to our committee, we will take action on these two bills.
