SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I misspoke a few minutes ago and I misunderstood Senator Frank Lewis and he was merely telling me that there was going to be an executive meeting of the Referral Board under the South balcony and I understood him to say that the paraphernalia bill had been referred to Judiciary Committee. This is wrong. It was not referred to Judiciary Committee. I understand it has been referred to Public Health and Welfare. I thought that the bill should have been referred to Judiciary because it has to do more with penalties and so forth rather than health but I just wanted to make it clear for the record that I had misspoken and the bill was not referred to Judiciary but had been referred to Public Health. Thank you.
