LB 797, 810

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are ready for Final Reading. All legislators please be in their seats. We are ready for Final Reading. The Chair would remind you once that this is the week that we set the tone for the rest of the session. If we have to constantly beg legislators to get to their seats so we can get their vote, the majority of bills pending will never see the light of day, which may be a good idea too. I'm not sure, but the fact of the matter is, if legislators do now wish to abide by the constitution and we constantly have to beg you to come and sit down, then we are never going to get any place the rest of the session. So, are we ready for Final Reading? All unauthorized personnel leave the floor. The Clerk will read on Final Reading, LB 797.

CLERK: (Read LB 797 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT LUEDTKE PRESIDING

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 797 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 942 of the Legislative Journal.) 41 ayes, 0 nays, 7 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 797 passes with the emergency clause attached. We will now read on Final Reading, Mr. Clerk, LB 810.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Beutler moves to return LB 810 to Select File for a specific amendment and the amendment would read as follows: (Read Beutler amendment found on page 942 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: (mike not activated) ...Legislature, I will try to be quick with this. I hate to bring it back off of Final Reading but I do think we are leaving ourselves open just a little bit here. This bill basically provides, as you may recall, that the State Fire Marshal can prohibit certain types of fires either on a statewide
