the purpose of the Beutler amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. The question is on the return. Record the vote.

CLERK: 7 ayes, 27 nays on the motion to return, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. We will now read on Final Reading, Mr. Clerk, LB 810.

CLERK: (Read LB 810 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 810 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on page 943 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 7 excused and not voting, 2 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 810 passes with the emergency clause attached. Next bill on Final Reading, Mr. Clerk, is LB 817.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Murphy moves to return LB 817 to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I don't know where it is all going to end. Last week we only had three teachers' pension bills. Now we are about to cut all the strings on what the people had previously said should be a limit to what we will contribute to retirement of University people. I would like to ask Senator Fowler a question if I may.

PRESIDENT: Will you respond, Senator Fowler?

SENATOR FOWLER: Always glad to answer Senator Murphy's questions if I can.

SENATOR MURPHY: Thank you, Senator Fowler. Senator Fowler, what will be the fiscal impact of this bill five years from today?
