CLERK: (Read LB 886 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 886 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote found on pages 946-947 of the Legislative Journal.) 40 ayes, 0 nays, 8 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 886 passes with the emergency clause attached. The Clerk will now read on Final Reading, LB 932.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Nichol moves to return LB 932 to Select File for a specific amendment. The specific amendment is as follows: (Read Nichol amendment as found on page 947 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this was brought to my attention over the weekend by Dr. Nyman who is the Director of the visually impaired for the State of Nebraska and he states that this is necessary because people using white canes would not be allowed in certain public places although their seeing eye dogs would be allowed, for example, skating rinks, other public places where many visually impaired people use their white canes instead of a seeing eye dog.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I do agree with Senator Nichol's amendment. This bill is a good vehicle to attach this amendment and if they need it this would be the only chance to amend it into law this session, therefore, I support the amendment.
