CLERK: Senator Keyes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

CLERK: You had voted aye, Senator Keyes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Venditte.

CLERK: Senator Vickers voting aye. Senator Kremer voting aye. Senator Hefner voting aye. Senator Marsh voting aye.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.
