and members of the body. All this amendment does, it refers to the Uniform Commercial Code 1-201 and it is a definition of notification. The purpose of this amendment is to be sure that those people that have put improvements on their property are properly notified. That is the real purpose of this amendment. The Uniform Commercial Code gives a good definition. They either can put it in the paper. They can hand them the notification that this is required or in any way that the county sees fit. We felt this was a better approach than to say that you have to do it such and such a way. This leaves it up to the county for its own option in notifying the individual and it gives the right of repeal situation. I move adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Sieck amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. We are voting on the Sieck amendment to LB 689. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Sieck's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Senator Carsten, do you want to move the advancement of the bill?

SENATOR CARSTEN: I move LB 689 as amended to E & R Initial, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted?

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion carries. The bill is advanced. Next, LB 800.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 800 was introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by the members. Title read. The bill was read on January 16, referred to Business and Labor, advanced to General File. Senator Maresh's committee has committee amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, LB 800 was brought to the committee by the Labor Department, by the Labor Commissioner.
