SENATOR JOHNSON: Why don't we go ahead with a Call of the House. Let's do that.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We don't have any choice in the matter. Shall the House go under Call? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 2 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel leave the floor. Senator Landis, Senator Koch, Senator Kahle, Senator Dworak, Senator Haberman, Senator Kelly, Senator Pirsch, Senator Haberman. Yes, the Clerk is authorized to accept call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye. Senator Hefner voting aye. Senator Lamb voting aye. Senator Haberman and Senator Landis both voting aye. Senator Barrett voting aye. I got you, Senator Haberman. Senator Haberman voting no, excuse me. Senator Murphy, you had voted no, Senator.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Roll call vote has been requested. Will all legislators please take your seats so we can proceed with the roll call vote. Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote was taken as found on pages 981 and 982 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 6 nays on adoption of Senator Johnson's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp now moves to amend the bill and his amendment...he has two amendments. The first is on page 881 of the Journal. Senator DeCamp's amendment, Mr. President, on page 881. Senator DeCamp wants to withdraw both of them, Senator? Okay, I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell, do you want to advance the bill as amended?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I would like to briefly explain the bill. The bill sets up two...it gives the Liquor Commission an alternative to canceling a license. It allows them to suspend or revoke which is also an alternative, which they feel will help them, assist them in terms of being able to
