SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, so it is your intent basically to make it easier to find violations of the regulations.

SENATOR NEWELL: That is...well, it's...it's to make it... yes, the intent is to, you know, it is still very subjective anyway. The intent is to clarify that the commission has the authority to make those decisions and to give them other remedies other than cancellation...other than solely cancellation.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, the other thing I didn't quite understand, suspending a license is the temporary interruption of all rights and privileges. Cancelling it is to discontinue all rights and privileges. Revoking means to permanently void and recall all rights and privileges. I guess I really don't understand what a cancellation is. Are you discontinuing on a permanent basis? Or is a cancellation a temporary discontinuance, and in that case is it....how does it differ from a suspension?

SENATOR NEWELL: What page number is that?

SENATOR BEUTLER: This would be page 10 of the white copy of the amendments...the underlying material.

SENATOR NEWELL: Well, if they revoke a license you can never again...the individual can never again apply for a liquor license in the State of Nebraska. To cancel, it means to interrupt the use of that, but then...in other words they cannot...that license is cancelled. They may apply at some other time. And to suspend is obviously to suspend.

SENATOR BEUTLER: If they cancel a license, can somebody else apply for that license then?

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I believe they could.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill as amended. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Voting to advance the bill as amended. 848. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

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
