LB 884, 771

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? Okay, the question before the House is, shall debate cease? Shall debate cease on the motion to advance 884 to E & R for Review? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, I am not going to be long in closing because Senator Beutler very well laid out the reasons why this bill ought to be passed. I tried to point out to you that it requires the expenditures of money that are needed desperately for constructive purposes. I again repeat that the State of Nebraska with all of its subdivisions under Chapter 14, does not require bonding. I believe the state is under Chapter 70, and why should we impose this extra expenditure on the NRDs when they are responsible? The one mill levy that they are allowed to collect establishes responsibility, and I see no reason why the natural resource districts should be subject to this kind of an expenditure that really is not needed. They are responsible people and they desperately need the money that could be involved here in the carrying out of constructive projects. I move again the advancement of LB 884.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance 884 to E & R for Review. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. The motion is the advancement of the bill to E & R for Review. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, 771.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 771 was introduced by the Education Committee. (Read title to LB 771.) The bill was read on January 25, referred to Education and advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill...no committee amendments. Mr. President.
