LB 839, 839A

SENATOR NEWELL: It took my breath away. Senator Lamb, could you explain again why you are supporting this bill, because I think....

SENATOR LAMB: I am supporting it because these wards come primarily to the populous centers from all over the state, and so that places an undue burden on these populous centers such as Omaha and Lincoln. That is unfair, so I am saying that the state should assume that burden.

SENATOR NEWELL: Thank you, Howard.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell, are you done, or are you stunned? Is there any further debate on the bill? Senator Wesely, what do you want to do with the bill?

SENATOR WESELY: It is with great pleasure that I move for the advancement of this bill where we can bring together urban and rural interests in this state and support together an important piece of legislation. Thank you, Senator Lamb.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the advancement of 839. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion is carried. The bill is passed to E & R. 939A, Senator Wesely. 839A, pardon me.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. I would like to move for the advancement of LB 839A.

SENATOR CLARK: The question is the advancement of 839A. Is there any debate? If not, the question before the House is the advancement of 839A. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The bill is advanced.
