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legislation. I believe that this legislation is very sound. Laws of this kind are now in over twenty states. We have heard no complaint from any of the states that have it. Under this court, under this bill, if the court determines that the child's best interests are served by visitation, then these grandparents will once again be allowed to experience the joy that comes from having grandchildren near them and the grandchildren can experience the joy of companionship with their grandparents. I urge you to defeat Senator Hoagland's kill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler and then Senator Kahle. We are on the kill motion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I support the kill motion. Where is the Commission on the Status of Women when we really need them? I hope you all realize it is really women we are talking about here for the most part. Custody of the children in most cases is going to be in the woman and basically what you are saying to women is that now that you are alone doing this job, you have fewer custodial rights than you had when you had somebody helping you do the job. It is as simple as that. Is that what you want? Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Kahle, are you there?

SENATOR KAHLE: Mr. Speaker and members, I have heard a lot of legal language today and things that I probably don't understand very well but I will tell you one thing I understand and that is what being a grandpa means. That I understand and I certainly would not want my rights jeopardized as a grandfather to see my grandchildren. Now if you lawyers want to fight the legal part of it and get the language just the way you want it, that is fine, but the bill as it seems to appear to me would do what we need to do with the court making the decision. So I would hope that you would not deprive grandparents of at least a chance to visit or to have their grandchildren visit them. I think that would be one of the most cruel things you could possibly do. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Nichol a question. Senator Nichol, under this bill are these grandparents who want rights, they are talking about rights now, not privileges, are they required to contribute to the financial
