SENATOR NICHOL: I just wanted to ask Senator Maresh if this would allow grandparents to go visit the grandchildren.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of the Maresh amendment to LB 619 vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting on the Maresh amendment to LB 619. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President, that is only 21 people voting. I think we have more support than the 15 votes on this. I will have to have a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House is shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take their seats, unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Record your presence. The Clerk is authorized to take call in votes. The issue before the House is the Maresh amendment to LB 619.

CLERK: Senator Chronister voting yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Let's see, Senator Cope, Senator Schmit. The House is under Call. The House is under Call. When the House is under Call, all legislators must be in their seats.

CLERK: Senator Kahle voting yes. Senator Lewis voting no. Senator Fowler voting no. Senator Vickers voting aye. Senator Beutler voting yes. Senator Venditte voting aye. Senator Wagner voting no.
