LB 618

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 618.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Reutzel moves to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay it over.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the bill is laid over. What the Chair proposes to do between now and the end of the session is to set up a special lay over area for those bills on Select File and you can handle them the same way you do on General File, request that the bill be brought up so that it can be considered. LB 94, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 94, I have E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR CULLAN: I would like to move to suspend the rules and take up LB 618 now.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. The motion is to suspend the rules and take up 618. This requires 30 votes. Senator Kelly, your light is on. Do you wish to be recognized on the motion? Senator Newell, your light is on. Okay, the motion before the House is the suspension of the rules so that 618 can be taken up today instead of tomorrow. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. It takes 30 votes. This is a suspension of the rules to bring 618 up at this time. Have you all voted? Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: How many people are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Two, four, six, seven, seven are excused plus five committee members. The motion before the House is the suspension of the rules to take up LB 618. Have you all voted?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, I would ask for a Call of the House.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed
