SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, things are looking better especially since Senator DeCamp has come in.

SPEAKER MARVEL: I am going to call for the vote.

SENATOR VENDITTE: Mr. Speaker, I would then request a Call of the House, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question before the House, is shall the House go under Call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, 1 nay to go under call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats, record your presence. Unauthorized personnel leave the floor. All legislators must be in their seats under a Call of the House. We cannot proceed until you move to your seats. The Chair is going to be firm once again. Please get to your seats. We are under a Call of the House. You are as much aware of what that means as I am. Will the legislators please return to their seats? Sergeant at Arms. Senator Chronister, will you record your presence, please? Senator Dworak, Senator Fowler, Senator Keyes. Mr. Sergeant at Arms, we need three people. Senator Fowler is here. Senator Keyes. Okay, Senator Venditte. Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote found on page 1026 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hold the phone. We are going to hold this up until all legislators get in their seats. You have to wait for a roll call.

CLERK: (Continued with roll call vote.) 18 ayes, 25 nays on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Senator Newell. The motion is to advance 619 to E & R for engrossment. A machine vote has been requested. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is the advancement of 619 to E & R for engrossment. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 16 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Are we ready for the next bill, Mr. Clerk?
