school system to move over to the State Retirement System and elsewhere in the statute there is a prohibition that might create the impression that they can't do that. So this basically is an amendment to harmonize that definition of who can be in the State Retirement System with the language in the bill. Again, it was requested by the State Retirement Office and I would move for its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of amendments to LB 818 as found on page 907 of the Journal. All those in favor of the adoption of the amendments say aye, okay... SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the amendment is adopted. Now are we ready for the bill as amended? Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I guess...the description on the green sheet is a little ambiguous and I would just like to refresh people's memory as to what the bill does. It deals with specifically employees of the State Department of Education. It allows those employees who wish to transfer to the State Employees Retirement System and that is all that the bill does. The description on the green sheet makes it sound maybe that it is much broader than that. It is only to allow people in the State Department of Education who are now under the School Employees Retirement System to be able to move over to the State Employees Retirement System.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 818 as amended. All those in favor say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is LB 801.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are no E & R amendments to LB 801. I do have amendments by Senator Murphy. The first is to amend LB 801, Section 2, strike the new material and reinstate the stricken matter in lines 16 and 17.
