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attention to the water study and the coordination problems that get involved with this whereby we had to withhold the funds until the contracts were in place, that those agencies would cooperate with each other before we could get any movement in the water study coordination and I suggest to you, to the Education Committee and to this Legislature that by merely putting up a coordinating committee and \$32,000 in the statutes, you go home thinking that you have done some coordination, that is a myth. You can get some coordination if you lay that on somebody's back like Dr. Campbell, the Director of Education, and give her the authority to order those other agencies to perform the functions that are needed, but to have another \$32,000 committee meeting, I would agree with Senator Murphy. That is just a waste of money and it is a shell game thinking that we have done some coordinating that we have not done. I support Senator Murphy's motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I see these things grow in the Appropriations Committee. Senator Beutler, in a perspective of \$251,000,000, \$32,000 is innocuous when you look at it relative to the total state budget, but next year it will be another clerk and another typewriter and then the following year it will be an executive secretary and then another clerk and then we will need somebody to design the brochures for the annual report so we will need a staff artist and on and on and on, plus the fact this particular agency now will then go in line for all of our particular policies, if we are going to raise travel x percent, if we are going to raise salaries x percent, if we are going to raise continuation budgets x percent and on until there is no end. I have real difficulty of separately creating an agency, an independent agency made up of department heads of other agencies. I have real difficulty with this. I think these specific department heads need to sit down and coordinate, but I think that is a function of the agencies each one of these department heads head up and whatever staff and whatever money is needed for this particular purpose should be gleaned out of those agency budgets, but to create two separate budgets, one for the Department of Education, one for the Department of Welfare and then on top of that a coordinating council which are comprised up of the very same people and the very same agency heads and the very same employees, you know, I have heard of double digit inflation. This is double digit bureaucracy. We are creating bureaucracy on bureaucracy. So I think this particular approach is a wrong approach and I think Senator Murphy's amendment is

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
