CLERK: Mr. President, LR 206 was introduced by Senator Rumery and is found on page 966 of the Journal. (Read LR 206.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Rumery.

SENATOR RUMERY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Mr. President, I wonder if we might have a little order on the floor?

PRESIDENT: Yes, sir, that is a good idea because I couldn't even hear you say that. I couldn't even hear you ask for order. (gavel.) Could we pay some attention to the presenter of this resolution? Senator Rumery, continue.

SENATOR RUMERY: Thank you, Mr. President. I appreciate the Legislature giving this recognition to Ted Long who is one of our very honored citizens in District 42. He is a man that has developed a great ability as an artist and he was asked to develop this bust of Standing Bear that is placed now in the continuation of the Hall of Fame which is just the hall right north of us. He is largely a self-taught artist that has a tremendous amount of talent and I appreciate the Legislature taking this opportunity to officially recognize him. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any further discussion on LR 206? If not, the question is, shall ... the motion is to pass and adopt the resolution. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay.
