PRESIDENT: Move adoption...stands for itself. All those in favor of adopting LR 210 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on LR 210? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LR 210 is adopted. We are ready for agenda item #6, special orders, two of them. Commence, the first one on special order is LB 853.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 853 was introduced by the Agricultural and Environment Committee and signed by its membership. (Read LB 853 by title.) The bill was first read on January 22 of this year. It was referred to the Ag and Environment Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Schmit's Agricultural and Environment Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Schmit, speaking on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this bill provides for a reasonable method of disposing of hazardous wastes. The committee amendments strikes some innocuous language but they add also a few words which read, "material resulting from industrial, commercial and mining operations." It was inadvertently left out of the original legislation. I move the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the adoption of the committee amendment on LB 853? Hearing none, I guess that will constitute your opening and your closing. All those in favor of adopting the committee amendment on LB 853 vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schmit, there are a couple of amendments but I believe it would be preferrable if you would explain the bill at this point and then we will take up the amendments. So if you will proceed, the Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.
