LB 916, 780

SPEAKER MARVEL: Before we proceed, and this will not be taken off of your time, in the North balcony, there are 35 students, band students, from Allen High School, Allen, Nebraska, Miss Helen Mogen is the teacher and there are two, four, six, eight, nine chaperones. Where are you located? Do you want to raise your hands so we can say good morning? Also in the North balcony...those people were from Senator Murphy's district. From Senator De Camp's district are ten high school students from Neligh High School, Neligh, Nebraska, and they don't have any chaperones. Where are you? Senator Clark, do you wish to close?

SENATOR CLARK: All this bill is is a one bank holding company and not a multibank holding company. That is all they do. It is probably as simple a bill as you could ever get a hold of because of the fact that it is a one bank holding company and what they are doing is merging a state bank into another charter of a one bank holding company and that is all it can do and I would move for the bill to be advanced, please.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All in favor of advancing the bill to E & R for review vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. Next bill, LB 780.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 780 was introduced by Senator Marsh. (Read title.) The bill was read on January 16, referred to the Government Committee. It was advanced to General File. There are no amendments, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this bill was introduced at the request of Lancaster County. Formerly Lancaster County and the City of Lincoln had a joint commission. Then the Attorney General said the county doesn't have permission to do this so because of this Attorney General opinion we have come to the Legislature to ask that the county be allowed on a voluntary basis to have a joint commission with the City of Lincoln. I urge your support for LB 780.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no.
