SENATOR HOAGLAND: No, it does not, Senator Johnson.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: No, it doesn't, Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: It doesn't go that far.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: No.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Okay, thank you.
