SENATOR KAHLE: Okay, that satisfies my question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is to advance the bill as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We are voting on advancement of 855 to E & R for review. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill is 633.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 633 was introduced by the Ag and Environment Committee. (Title read.) The bill was read on January 9, referred to Ag and Environment, was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments by Senator Schmit's Ag and Environment Committee.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the committee amendment deals with the definition and regulations in regard to hermetically sealed seeds. As you can see in the bill book it provides that seeds hermetically sealed containers should be sold within thirty-six months. I move the committee amendments be adopted.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is on the adoption of the committee amendments to 633. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? We are voting on the committee amendments to 633. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried and the committee amendments are adopted. Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Chairman, this bill, LB 633, is a house-keeping bill for the Department of Agriculture. It repeals some obsolete statutes. It also provides for the authority for the Department of Agriculture to engage in joint use of computer services. Basically it is merely updating the statutes for the Department of Agriculture. I move the advancement of LB 633.
