SENATOR COPE: When someone asked you a bit ago about the fiscal impact, I presume you had reference to the amendments when you said it would be less. Now the bill I see has a \$500,000 impact, is that correct?

SENATOR GOODRICH: That is the fiscal note but you can completely ignore that because there is only twenty of the youngsters that have, excuse me, I am sorry, there is only twenty identifiable cases that are adult. There are one hundred and twenty cases in the state but that includes all cases. Only twenty of them are in the adult category. The fiscal people did not understand that we were limiting this to the adults only. I guarantee you, in fact the A bill will be introduced in the next day or two for this bill and it will be \$75,000, no more.

SENATOR COPE: That includes these three...

SENATOR GOODRICH: All three of them for \$75,000, right.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Haberman, your light was on.

SENATOR HABERMAN: A question of Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Okay.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator Goodrich, would you object in regards to what Senator Johnson said on page 2, line 5, of removing "of all ages with genetically handicapped conditions" and just list these three?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Let's not do it today. Let's do it on Select File and I will talk to you in the meantime.

SENATOR HABERMAN: But you wouldn't probably object to it?

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would be glad to work with you.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, I am going to find out what that means so thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to advance the bill as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. We have got one more bill. The motion is the advancement of 989 to E & R for review. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is carried. The bill is advanced.
