SENATOR KAHLE: Might as well.

CLERK: Senator Dworak, are you voting, sir? Voting no. Senator Clark voting aye. Senator Fitzgerald voting no. Senator Hoagland voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want a roll call vote? Okay. Here comes Senator Labedz. Okay, all legislators will be in their seats. Clerk will call the roll. This is if you are in favor of the Kahle motion...the Kahle amendment to LB 666 vote aye, otherwise vote no. Clerk will call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on pages 1084 and 1085 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hold the Call. All legislators will be in their seats. We are still under Call. Okay, go ahead.

CLERK: (Continued with roll call vote.) 19 ayes, 17 nays on the motion to adopt Senator Kahle's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Do you have any other motions on 666?

CLERK: Mr. President, yes, sir, I do. Senator George now moves to amend the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised. Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Thank you, Mr. President. Would the Clerk please read the amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator George moves to amend the bill: (Read the George amendment as found on page 1085 of the Legislative Journal.)
