PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I pushed my button because I wanted to speak on the bill. However, since I am here at this point I might ask a question about the amendment. Now, Senator Lewis, how does this affect...Senator Kremer brought to us a bill which deals with the same sort of subject, I am wondering what relationship this amendment has to that bill?

SENATOR LEWIS: Senator Kremer's amendment particularly deals with Class VI schools and Class Is. This is three to three and to my knowledge Bellevue is the only Class III district with a boundary so contiguous that it laps into another Class III district.

SENATOR LAMB: This is strictly between Class III districts?

SENATOR LEWIS: Three to threes.

SENATOR LAMB: And you want to have the people that are annexed vote which district they go into?

SENATOR LEWIS: You bet, that is right.

SENATOR LAMB: And it will either be Bellevue or...?

SENATOR LEWIS: Or Papillion.

SENATOR LAMB: Or Papillion.

SENATOR LEWIS: Yes, those are the only two, and the way it is now, Senator Lamb, is part of those would come in not with even a vote because that as the city moves forward in some cases, if those were formed by petition, the school district would just take them in and I am concerned both ways on that issue.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you.
