SENATOR JOHNSON: All right, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Johnson, while you are standing there, the Chair wants to take this opportunity, I found out today was your birthday, so on behalf of all of us here we would like to wish Vard a happy birthday. The Chair recognizes Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Well, Senator Lewis has come over to me. I wanted to ask him some questions about it because he is getting into my bivouac and I want to know what is going on before I support it and so I will go over across the aisle and talk with the good Senator from Bellevue and hope that Bellevue and Platteview School District do not become a battleground.

PRESIDENT: Is that a question, Senator Keyes, or a statement.

SENATOR KEYES: No, that is my testimony on the floor of the Legislature.
