PRESIDENT: Okay. The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy. Pardon me, Senator Murphy, did you want to talk? I see the light is out.

SENATOR MURPHY: No, you had just acknowledged Senator Johnson's birthday and I was going to tell him to enjoy it because the way he has been voting he may never have another one.

PRESIDENT: (Laughter) From this vantage point, he looks terribly worried. That is all, Senator Lewis. If you want to close, you may close.

SENATOR LEWIS: I think I have explained it as well as I can. It is Class III to Class III and says under no provision shall anyone go into another school district unless that annexed area has had a right to vote on where they choose to go.

PRESIDENT: The question before the House then is the adoption of the Lewis amendment to LB 743. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Lewis' amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The Lewis amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Cullan had an amendment but I understand he wishes to withdraw.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Cullan withdraws his amendments and they are withdrawn. Any further amendments?

CLERK: No, sir, I do not have any further.

PRESIDENT: We are ready then to move the bill on. Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, fellow colleagues, two questions came up last time. One of the questions, are the private as well as the public school buses covered under this bill? Yes, indeed they are. The other question that came up is when is the State Patrol and are the State Patrol going to inspect these buses to see that they do have the safety stickers and the question is, yes, the State Patrol will inspect the buses to see that they do have the mechanical safety stickers.
