LB 346

SENATOR KAHLE: Thank you, Senator Murphy. I guess I have a problem trying to figure out what will be considered filings for the counties and what will be dual filings and I guess I also have concerns about the staff it is going to take to do it. I think the Secretary of State has said something about four additional people, at least in the conversations I've had with part of his staff, and I think if you are going to do this, you are going to run into much more of a staff than that and as Senator Murphy himself has said, it is hard to tell what the cost will be after we get this going. My people that I talked to, the implement dealers, the bankers, the people that would use this service are really not all that thrilled about having it here in Lincoln and at home both. So I guess you are going to have to use your own judgment voting for it but I am going to have to vote against it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy, did you wish to speak? Yes, Senator Murphy, this is on the DeCamp amendment.

SENATOR MURPHY: No, I have no problem with Senator DeCamp's amendment, and if John is not there, I would move the adoption of Senator DeCamp's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The question then is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment to LB 346. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Voting on the DeCamp amendment. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator DeCamp's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. The DeCamp amendment is adopted. Are there any further amendments?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy. Senator Murphy, we are ready to move the bill on, Senator.

SENATOR MURPHY: I move advancement of the bill as amended.

PRESIDENT: A machine vote has been requested. The motion is to advance LB 346 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the advance to E & R for engrossment of LB 346. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 4 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.
