it seemed to be the consensus of this body that if we were to establish a rather solid type of residency that there would be no concern and I believe we have been fair in terms of saying at least two years. At that time we should be able to consider these people as having shown good faith in establishing a residence in the State of Nebraska. It would help them to qualify for the university or state college system on a tuition we consider for the residents of this state. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion then is the adoption of the Koch amendment to LB 304. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to adopt Senator Koch's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and the Koch amendment is adopted. Any further amendments on LB 304?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Murphy now moves to indefinitely postpone the bill. That will lay it over.

PRESIDENT: All right, it will be laid over until we take up the indefinite postpone motion. We will go then to LB 730.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 730 has E & R amendments pending.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments to LB 730.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the E & R amendments on LB 730. All those in favor of adopting the E & R amendments to LB 730 signify by saying aye, opposed nay. The E & R amendments are adopted on LB 730. Any other amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Johnson now moves to amend the bill and his amendment is printed on page 1010 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Johnson.

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. President, members of the body, this is a very small amendment. In fact it is so small it is almost a shame to even bring it up. LB 730, yes, right, John said it makes you suspicious when you start out with
