LB 689, 849A, 82

SENATOR CARSTEN: I so move, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Voice vote. All those in favor of advancing 689 to E & R for engrossment say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. The next bill, 849A. We already advanced 849 so the motion is to advance 849A. Sombdy from Miscellaneous Subjects. Do you want to make the motion?

SENATOR NEWELL: It is \$2,000 out of cash funds. I move the advancement of the A bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor with that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. What other one do we have? The next bill we will turn to is on the next page, 986. Before we take up that bill, I would like to introduce from Senator Maresh's District in the North balcony 38 students, Senior Government Class, from Meridian Public Schools at Daykin, Nebraska, Mr. Schwan, teacher, and Mr. Warren, Principal. Where are you located? Hold up your hand so we can say good morning to you. Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: The bill we are on is LB 82, constitutional amendment concerning judges discipline. I am handing out to you a copy of the editorial. I would move the advancement of the bill.

CLERK: We need the E & R amendments first, Senator.

SENATOR REUTZEL: All right, I'd move the adoption of the E & R amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of adopting E & R amendments to LB 82 say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. The E & R amendments are adopted. Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I would move the advancement of the bill, then, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the advancement of 82, LB 82, to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. Motion carried. Bill is advanced. The next bill is 986.
