SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption....do you want to close? Okay.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the Simon amendment to LB 308. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is the Simon amendment to LB 308. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion carried. Do you have another amendment, Mr. Clerk?
