SENATOR FITZGERALD: That's all this does is put the bill in its original form. When we had that committee hearing down there we was going to take all the interest bills and put them separate and I wanted to take this off and put it over onto the gasoline bill, and they tell me it is not feasible to do it because they figured this is too much conflict of interest putting them both on the same bill. So I hope you support me by putting this back on 279, Section 1 of the original bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to read the motion again?

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is return 279 to Select File for a specific amendment, the amendment being: (Read the Fitzgerald amendment.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the return of the bill for a specific amendment. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? The motion is to return the bill for a specific amendment. Have you all voted? Senator Fitzgerald, what is your pleasure?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: I don't want to do it but it looks like I have to. I don't want to do it and I won't.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 4 nays to return the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Now the motion is to adopt the amendment....you returned the bill for a specific amendment. Now, what is the specific amendment?

CLERK: To strike the Fitzgerald amendment found on page 1002 of the Journal and reinstate the stricken language.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, all those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. This is on page 1002, right?

CLERK: 1002, yes.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you all voted? You have returned the bill. Now this is voting on the amendment. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Fitzgerald's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. Do you want to readvance the bill?
