

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I would like to have a Call of the House. Not too many people are paying attention. I would like to bring them in here and have them vote on this issue.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Question is shall the House go under Call. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record.

CLERK: 4 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All legislators please take your seats. Record your presence. Unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Have you all recorded your presence? There are four absent. We are getting back in the same rut that we were in yesterday. We can't get legislators in to record their presence, so we can't proceed with the work at hand. Senator Lamb, Senator Maresh, Senator Johnson, Senator Kremer, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Simon, Senator Labeledz, Senator Burrows, Senator Kremer, Senator Labeledz, Senator Fenditte. The Clerk is authorized to accept call in votes.

CLERK: Senator Stoney voting aye. Senator Cullan voting aye, had voted aye Senator. Senator Chambers voting aye. Senator Vickers voting aye, Senator Hoagland voting aye. Senator Clark voting no. Senator Merz changing from yes to no. Senator Warner voting aye. Senator Burrows voting aye. Senator Powers voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Excuse me. The House is under Call. All legislators are to be. . . Senator Newell, Senator Newell. We are not soliciting votes. You have been told this a dozen times.

CLERK: Senator Chronister voting no. Senator Kennedy voting no. Senator Barrett voting no. Senator Haberman voting no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are still missing Senator Labeledz and Senator Venditte. Mr. Sergeant at Arms, have you called Senator Venditte and Senator Labeledz? Okay, Senator Newell, we have all but Senator Labeledz here.

SENATOR NEWELL: Mr. President, I would like to have a roll call vote to ask people to vote on this issue.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, roll call vote is requested. We are voting on the Newell amendment to 848. Call the roll.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 19 ayes, 25 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 1 absent and not voting. Vote appears on page 1163 of the Journal.
