SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. What is the next item? The Call is raised. Senator Keyes calling a meeting of the Government Committee underneath the north balcony.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator DeCamp has amendments on 881, I understand he wants to withdraw.

SENATOR DeCAMP: What is 881?

CLERK: That is the page in the Journal that your amendments are on Senator.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh. Mr. President, when I have full explanation of the Legislature, what is involved in the bill and 25 votes, because I think once you know what is going on you will vote for it, then I will bring up the amendments. In the meantime, I'll pull them off and let the bill go. I don't think that it should advance until you get something done on it because you are making some dramatic increases and you didn't deal with that at all.

CLERK: I now have . . . Senator DeCamp, you have another amendment. Do you want that withdrawn temporarily? Senator DeCamp.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

CLERK: You have a second amendment, Senator. Do you want that withdrawn as well?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I'll withdraw it in the interest of saving time and it will have to be adopted in some form before you go much further.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell now amends. . . .

SENATOR NEWELL: Pat, lets withdraw that. We will advance the bill and see if we can get together, maybe work something out. The bill has no increases in it now as contrary to Senator DeCamp's statement. Lets withdraw that. Do I have other amendments up there?

CLERK: No, that is the last one I have for you.

SENATOR NEWELL: All right.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Powers moves to indefinitely postpone the bill. That would lay the bill over.
