and we can't do our function. This is a distortion of the committee system. With that in mind I think that this body has a responsibility to send this bill to the Revenue Committee where it must be dealt with in light and in a relationship to all other insurance premium tax questions. If it is not done it is a travesty of the committee system, it is wrong and it will come back to haunt us either next year or the year after. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the re-referral of the bill as explained by Senator Newell. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 24 nays on the the motion to re-refer the bill.
