LR 213, 214, 215

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of LR 213. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The resolution is adopted. Now we go to LR 214.

CLERK: (Read LR 214 as found on page 1119 of the Journal.) It is found on page 1119, Mr. President, of the Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the resolution speaks for itself. I move for its adoption.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other discussion? The motion is the adoption of LR 214. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted on the approval of LR 214? Record the vote.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.
