SENATOR CLARK: Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Is this closing on it?

SENATOR CLARK: No, Senator DeCamp will close.

SENATOR NICHOL: Is there anybody else?

SENATOR CLARK: No.

SENATOR NICHOL: I might just say I am not objecting to Senator DeCamp's amendment because with these new hybrids and so forth it is possible to have raw marijuana with a higher percentage than 6% so I would go along with his amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. It takes a majority of those voting. A record vote has been asked for. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 24 ayes, 3 nays on adoption of Senator DeCamp's amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CLARK: The DeCamp amendment is adopted. Now we are on the amendment of Senator Nichol's for the committee amendment.

SENATOR NICHOL: I move for the advancement of this amendment, Mr. Chairman, then the only one after that would be the E clause.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the committee amendment. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of the amended committee amendment number four.
