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isn't represented by Kearney itself but by, it could be by someone in another area or any or a lot of the other districts. That is an election and I just can't see why we should be divided and have one district have more members than another. That is the part I don't understand. If you can give me a better explanation than that, why, let me know.

SENATOR GOODRICH: All I am saying is that by doing it this way, and granted it would have one extra member on this particular commission, however, by doing it this way, we would at least guarantee a voice, not a majority, not anything else, but a voice, a single voice, at least one member from approximately one third of the state. The way it is now, one fourth of this state is not even represented on it.

SENATOR COPE: I can understand your argument but couldn't I then amend that and say we want one for the City of Kearney or the City of Grand Island because we are not being represented. I know that we are not as large but in proportion, isn't that reasonable, so we would have another member also and probably all of the other districts would come in with the same request.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Well, put it this way, Ron, I don't know the circumstances around Kearney and who represents what on, you know, what area is there. Consequently, all I know is and all I am dealing with in this particular case is one fourth of the state that I do know about and that is not represented and, consequently, I am requesting a solution to that problem. Now if you have the same problem out in Kearney, then I suggest you do the same thing.

SENATOR COPE: We are getting along, I think, all right as far as I know and I am not sure who it is but I would think that because of the great majority of people in Omaha and when the election comes up that you would have one. I just can't understand that part of it. If a man from Hartington, which is a long way away, I understand, but with your great majority of vote, I just can't understand why you are not represented in Omaha but thank you, Senator Goodrich.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Goodrich, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR GOODRICH: Sure.
