SENATOR CLARK: You have one minute left.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...as the fiscal note indicates that it would, then approximately \$270,000 would move into the hands of the distributors and away from our state treasury as a result of our overly generous three percent shrink allowance. Even though there has not been any additional showing of any additional losses to gallonage, there will still be that many new dollars moving into the hands of the distributors and that is simply a product of our increase in the gas tax...

SENATOR CLARK: Your time is up.

SENATOR JOHNSON: ...without any adjustment in the shrink. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Newell-Johnson amendment. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Once more, have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Johnson amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion lost. Do you have any more amendments?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lewis and DeCamp move to indefinitely postpone the bill.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, what John and I would like to do is that obviously there is a way to preclude debate on this issue, and rather than get into the kill issue, I'd just recommend that we don't vote to advance the bill and leave it there so we will withdraw our amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Amendment is withdrawn. Is there any more amendments?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, Senator Fitzgerald, is this your bill? What do you want to do with it?

SENATOR FITZGERALD: What does the bill say now, one cent,
