LB 485

SPEAKER MARVEL: Underneath the South balcony as guests of Senator Labeledz, it is my privilege to introduce Father Eugene McReynolds from Mt. Michael in Elkhorn and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. McReynolds from Grand Rapids, Michigan. Will you folks please rise so we may say good afternoon to you? The next order of business is LB 485, Senator Newell. Oh, I am sorry, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 485, title read. The bill was introduced January 17, 1979, referred to Miscellaneous Subjects. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Newell.

SENATOR NEWELL: Yes, I would like to...now these are the committee amendments?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes.

SENATOR NEWELL: I would like to withdraw the committee amendments but I want to take up the Newell amendments which are the compromise amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: What is your motion? Is your motion at the moment withdrawal of the committee amendments?

SENATOR NEWELL: To withdraw...now there is a distinction there and I don't know if we have it distinguished. The committee amendments I want to withdraw and I want to introduce then the Newell amendments which are, in fact, the compromise form of the bill. Have you got that?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR NEWELL: Okay, just briefly, the committee amendments or the Newell amendments which are a basic compromise, I brought a bunch of people down to my office and we spent an afternoon trying to work this out. I would like to adopt these amendments and I will explain them and they will become the bill. It is the white copy in your book. So with that, I move the adoption of the amendments.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is the motion to reject the committee amendments, Senator Newell?

SENATOR NEWELL: No, I am withdrawing the committee amendments, if I could.
