LB 592, 741

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the bill is laid over. 592.

CLERK: Mr. President, again, similar situation in that Senator Warner has amendments pending to 592 and he is excused until he arrives.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Hearing no objections, so ordered.  
LB 741.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are no E & R amendments. The first amendment I have on 741 is from Senator Hoagland. Senator Hoagland moves to amend the bill on page 3, line 2, strike "23-803," and in line 3 strike "23-805 to 23-807." That is offered by Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, as you know this is the bill that repeals a number of obsolete statutes in the Code of the Nebraska Statutes and what makes this particular bill constitutional in spite of the fact that in legislation a number of different chapters and a number of different articles in the Nebraska Code is that all the bills that are being repealed are obsolete bills and that is the common thread among all these various repealers and all the various chapters that holds the bill together and satisfies a single subject provision of the Constitution. Now this particular amendment that I put up now takes out of the repealer bill the provision that permits townships to levy a portion of a mill to support a township band. Now when we at first drafted the statute we thought that there were no township bands anywhere in the state and it turns out that there is a township band and that we have gotten some letters from throughout the state suggesting that this particular provision not be repealed at this time. So the amendment that I am offering right now takes out the provision repealing the township band provision and leaves everything else in the statute as approved by the Judiciary Committee and I would urge your support of this particular amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, do you want to repeal this law? Is that what you want to do? I mean, is that your goal, whether it is now or in some other bill?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Are you talking about the amendment, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Yes.
