SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay what is the motion before the House? Are you, Senator DeCamp, are you withdrawing your motion?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am withdrawing the motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Is there any objection? Okay, it is withdrawn. He made the motion and he can withdraw it. The rules indicate that until a vote is taken on an issue the introducer of the motion may withdraw without concurrence of the legislature. Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Just one question, Mr. Speaker. I don't believe that Senator DeCamp had the right to address the Chair to withdraw the motion. He had already spoken once.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, the rule, do you have your rule book handy? Turn to page 3, to start with. Rule 1, Section 12. Are you with me?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: It says the President may speak to a point of order in preference to members and shall decide the questions of order subject to a challenge to the legislature by any member on which challenge no member may speak no more than once unless by leave of the Legislature. In the event of a challenge to a ruling of the Chair the ruling may be, shall be restated and the question shall be phrased, shall the Chair be overruled. Then a majority of those present shall be required to overrule the Chair. It says that no member may speak more than once unless by leave of the Legislature. Senator DeCamp asked unanimous consent, there was no objection and we would consider that by leave of the Legislature unless..... somebody else has a better definition. Okay. We have other amendments to LB 741.
