CLERK: I have another amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Have you got another amendment?

CLERK: Yes. Mr. President, Senator Maresh moves to amend the bill. (Read the Maresh amendment as found on page 1238 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Call is raised. Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. Speaker, what this does, presently the law states that all patrol cars must be marked. This would allow those that are in a parked position for monitoring speed on the highways that these could be unmarked cars. If there is any questions I would be glad to answer them. Presently all patrol cars must be marked with a flashing red light and easily identified by the motorist. This would allow those that are parked for monitoring speed of passing vehicles, they could be unmarked. I move that this amendment be adopted.

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I don't this bill deals with what Senator Maresh is talking about. I can't locate what in the bill is connected with what he is talking about, so I think his amendment is not germane. I haven't seen it, and I don't know what flashing red lights would have to do with this bill as it is envisioned. So I am going to object to the amendment on the basis of it's not being appropriate.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Maresh, I have just been instructed by the Clerk that your amendment is out of order.

SENATOR MARESH: By the Clerk?

SENATOR CLARK: By the Clerk.

SENATOR MARESH: I think the Chair should rule on that.

SENATOR CLARK: It deals with Chapter 60 and the bill deals with Chapter 39.

SENATOR MARESH: But, Mr. President, the bill deals with checking speeds, and this is what this does, for that purpose...just for that purpose.
