SENATOR LEWIS: Does the Chair want me to respond to that?

SENATOR CLARK: No. Just so you will know what you are voting on, you are voting on the Lewis amendment to the Goodrich amendment. An amendment to the amendment takes a simple majority. All those in favor of the Lewis amendment vote aye. All those opposed vote no.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Well, Mr. Chairman, I would like everybody on record for this issue since it is tight enough and everybody has not had an opportunity to express their vote, so I would ask for a Call of the House.

SENATOR CLARK: Call of the House has been requested. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All legislators will take their seats. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. Record in, please. Will you record in, please? We are under Call. If all legislators will take their seats, please. Senator Goodrich, Senator Cope, Senator Koch, take your seats, please. Everyone will record in. For the information of those that have just come in, we are voting on Senator Lewis' amendment to Senator Goodrich's amendment. It takes a simple majority of those voting. The Clerk will take call-in votes. Senator Lewis. Call the roll. Calling the roll on the Lewis amendment to the Goodrich amendment to 833...533, pardon me.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote on LB 533 as found on page 1245 of the Legislative Journal.) 14 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.
