I urge you to oppose the Haberman amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Koch, do you want to speak on the Haberman amendment?

SENATOR KOCH: In respect to you, Mr. Speaker, I will move the previous question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. Shall debate cease? All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Shall debate cease? The motion before the House is to cease debate. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 5 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Debate is ceased. Senator Haberman, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and fellow colleagues, after talking to that fine, fine Senator Goodrich from Omaha and the other fine Senator Koch from Ralston, I think I have said enough, and that is my close. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The question is the adoption of the Haberman amendment to LB 995. All those in favor of the Haberman amendment vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.
