

discretionary spending on the floor this \$63,000 should go into competition with that, in my opinion. I hate to see us get involved with the Appropriations Committee budget. I think if the Appropriations Committee would have, like last year only put four or five million dollars for floor spending, I think I would be more sympathetic to it, but I think that there is plenty money on the floor and I think that that should take its logical place in competing for the rest of that floor money.

SENATOR KELLY: Senator Dworak, would it be your intention to support the A bill? That would be competing for the other funds that you are voting for on the floor?

SENATOR DWORAK: Well I would have to look at all of the other bills on the floor Senator Kelly, but I would think that this might be something that might get one of my votes, because I think now that the million dollar cut has held, I think that I would be inclined to look very favorably upon that A bill, frankly.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you very much.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner, do you have any other comments? Okay. The motion is the. . . .Senator Nichol, do you wish to close? The motion is the Nichol amendment to LB 995.
