

SENATOR HABERMAN: How much is that?

SENATOR DWORAK: It is eight million dollars, I believe.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Pardon?

SENATOR DWORAK: Eight million dollars.

SENATOR HABERMAN: We have got eight million dollars that the Legislature can spend. . .

SENATOR DWORAK: On the floor.

SENATOR HABERMAN: On the floor.

SENATOR DWORAK: That is right.

SENATOR HABERMAN: And, when this eight million dollars is to be spent, for example I presume that this million that I ask for will come out of this eight, is that correct?

SENATOR DWORAK: No. This. . .you are getting into the appropriation bill, Senator, that would not be part of that eight million. Now Senator Nichol has a special A bill which we voted on and I'm not sure if you have a special bill for this million in addition to this amendment, but if you had a special bill, an A bill, then that would compete for that eight million dollars.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Will this body be advised as to when we are voting on an expenditure as whether it comes out of that. . . .

SENATOR DWORAK: Yes, Senator Haberman, I think that is why we have A bills in our book number one, and number two, I think that is why we hold all A bills together toward the end so that you can look at, you know, everything that is being requested and make your decision as to how you want that eight million dollars spend. That is why we hold up A bills. You are well aware of it.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Marsh. That is a moot question, you were the last speaker. Senator Lamb, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature. I would make a couple of comments in regard to the program. Senator Burrows says that it is for the big ranchers, that is not necessarily true. It is true that you have to have a block of acres of a certain size but the smaller ranchers
