If you have a contribution in excess of \$50.00, it is apparently not legal and Senator Hoagland, will you tell me what do I do if by some strange coincidence I get a hundred dollar bill in the mail and there is no return address on it? Pardon?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Then....Senator DeCamp says his name is "charity".
